Procedure

For transfers or direct admissions, call the FirstHealth Transfer Center at (910) 715-BEDS (715-2337). Clinical information will be requested about the patient.

Helpful Information

- History of compliance with medications and outpatient treatment
- Patient's most recent clinical visit
- Patient's most recent hospitalization and discharge diagnosis
- Referring center's recommended/preferred aftercare plan
- Transportation plans (to and from Moore Regional Hospital)

- Current or history of significant medical problems
- List of current medications
- Potential for or history of extreme or dangerous behavior
- Medical Clearance: Each patient will be required to be evaluated by a physician at the time of the referral.

Involuntary Commitments (IVCs) may be referred to Moore Regional Hospital Inpatient Psychiatric Services. The primary concern will be an assessment of the potential for extremely violent or dangerous behavior to self and others. The referring agency should assure that all IVC forms (petition, custody/transportation order, and physician's exam) are sent with the patient as required by law.

Voluntary Admission referrals must be reviewed directly with health-care personnel prior to approval for admission to Moore Regional Hospital.

Transportation is the responsibility of the patient if he/she is a voluntary admission. It is preferred that the referring agency has a transportation plan in place prior to the discharge to ensure the patient will have a plan once he/she is discharged from Moore Regional Hospital.
