



VIOLENT RESTRAINTS

According to FirstHealth's Restraint Seclusion policy (R.20.01) any restraint that FULLY immobilizes a patient is considered a violent restraint (i.e. 4 point restraints).

If a patient is placed in bilateral wrist and ankle soft restraints—this is considered a violent restraint. The EMR will flag you in the order with the following message:

Selection of ALL soft restraints constitutes a 4-point restraint. You MUST deselect one item or place a VIOLENT Restraint order.

Process instructions: The duration should not exceed 1 day. Please set the start time to be the time the restraints are initiated. Restraints must be removed when an alternative is available and effective and/or patient no longer meets criteria. Orders must be renewed every calendar day or when discontinued. The MD must conduct a face to face assessment within 1 calendar day of initiation when initial restraint order is verbal. Selection of all 4 soft restraint constitutes a 4-point violent restraint. Deselect one item or place a Violent Restraint order.
